Standing Rules & Procedures

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF THE AMERICAS CENTRAL EAST COAST REGION

REGION PROCEDURES R-12

- D. The voting members of Conference shall be the members of the Region Board and the accredited delegates of each club in good standing.
- E. A club shall be deemed in good standing if all requirements of the Federation Bylaws and Procedures as well as all procedures established by the Region Conference and Region Board have been met at the time its delegates register.
- F. Delegates:
 - (1) The delegates of each club shall be the President and two (2) active members.
 - (2) A delegate may represent only the club in which the delegate's membership is held.

STANDING RULES FOR REGION CONFERENCE

- 1. All voting delegates shall be seated together in front seats promptly at the beginning of each session.
- 2. The Agenda, as adopted, shall be the order of the day.
- 3. Changes in the Agenda may be made only by majority vote of the Conference.
- 4. After addressing the Chair and being recognized each delegate shall clearly state her name and name of her club.
- 5. A voting member may speak twice upon a subject and only for two minutes. Other members may speak once upon a subject for two minutes only.
- 6. Both delegates and non-voting members shall be allowed the privilege of the floor but precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- 7. No conference discussion may be released for publicity unless first approved by the Public Relations Committee.
- 8. All motions of any length must be submitted in writing to the Secretary at the time they are made. Forms are available.
- 9. All reports shall be in writing and a copy handed to the Region Secretary at the time the report is given to the Conference.



SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF THE AMERICAS CENTRAL EAST COAST REGION

The elected delegates should have a working knowledge of Soroptimist Laws, Region Procedures, the objectives and ideals of the organization, and experience as a member of club committees or of the board. Understanding parliamentary procedure, ability to work with others, and a spirit of good will and understanding will help the delegate, the club, and the Conference Body.

The Club President, who is a delegate and who serves as the leader of the club's delegation should:

Allocate time at a business meeting to discuss topics in the agenda, so that a majority opinion
expressed by the club will serve as a guide to delegates.
Arrange with other delegates for dividing topics of the report on Conference to be given to the club.
Schedule time at a post-Conference club meeting, as soon as possible after Conference, for delegates
to present their reports.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CLUB DELEGATES

Before Conference, each delegate should:

- Study the Call
- Be sure all reservations are sent in promptly
- Clarify financial responsibilities, according to club procedures
- Collect materials, etc. to take to Conference, including Soroptimist pin

During Conference, each delegate should:

- Register promptly
- Be on time to all sessions
- Attend all sessions
- Be prepared to write down important business proceedings and background information to report to the club
- Be familiar with and observe the Conference Standing Rules
- Participate in discussion and debate
- Vote with the club viewpoint in mind. If instructed by the club to vote a certain way, vote that way. If
 not instructed, use your best judgment, considering the best interests of your club and of the all clubs
 in the Region.
- Be willing to accept an assignment from the Governor if asked.

After Conference, each delegate should prepare a report. Use the following outline to write your report:

- Action by Conference approving proposed changes in laws, the budget, or other matters presented to the voting body, and the reason for each action.
- Ideas for increasing club interest and support in attaining Soroptimist Goals.
- Summary of the workshops and committee presentations.
- The gist of speeches.
- A summary of proposals not approved by the Conference, and the reason for disapproval.
- Awards: who won them and why, hints for helping your club win next year.
- Your personal evaluation of the Conference.

2025 Spring Conference Speakers



Peggy Van Meter Board Member Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. Member, SI/Cumberland County, NJ

Peggy Gentile-Van Meter served a two-year term as Governor of the North Atlantic Region of Soroptimist International of the Americas 2018-2020. After her term as governor she stayed active in various roles as a Soroptimist member. Peggy continued as chair for the North Atlantic Region's Remembrance Committee, administrator for their website, and

Face Book page. She was a committee member for the SIA Big Dream Campaign. Her trip to Ireland for the SI Convention was an amazing experience and one she holds such wonderful memories of. Peggy was asked to serve on the SIA 2024 Convention Committee. During that time she was also a part of the first Leadership Program, and graduated at the SIA Convention. Peggy was elected to the SIA Board for the 2024-2026 term.

Peggy has always been an advocate for human rights. Her experience as an educator has given her insights on the importance of educating the public about the dangers and spread of human trafficking. She has spoken about this horrible world wide travesty in classrooms and workshops. Domestic Violence Education and Awareness is also very important to Peggy and she has often given presentations about this. She participates in many community education projects and events. Since joining Soroptimist in 2006, she has held several board positions at the regional level, including Governor-Elect, District Director, and District Secretary and is also a member of Soroptimist International of Cumberland County, NJ where she was honored in 2015 with SICC's Soroptimist of the Year award for her hard work and dedication. Peggy is very proud to be a contributing member of the SIA Laurel Society. Peggy is also a member of Lions International and a past committee member of South Jersey Holocaust Coalition. Peggy graduated from Cumberland County College in 1976, Glassboro State (Rowan University) in 1978 and earned her Masters in Holocaust & Genocide Education from Stockton University in 2001. Peggy has given several presentations on Women and the Holocaust. Peggy's other honors include induction into Cumberland County's Women's Hall of Fame (2011), Cumberland Regional High School Teacher of the Year (2006/2007), and Cumberland County Leadership Award (2004). Prior to retiring in 2012, Peggy taught history for more than 34 years at Cumberland Regional High School. Additionally, from 2006-2017 she served as adjunct History professor at Cumberland County College. When not doing Soroptimist work, she enjoys traveling, reading, volunteering and spending time with her family. Peggy has been married for 48 years and lives in a small rural farming community in Stow Creek, New Jersey. She has two children, Timothy and Jessica. Both are settled close by on the family farm. Peggy's four grandchildren are the sparks that light up her life.




Lisa Mangiafico Associate Senior Director Records and Risk Management Soroptimist International of the Americas Philadelphia, PA

Lisa Mangiafico is the Associate Senior Director Records and Risk Management at SIA headquarters. She was hired by SIA as our archivist



Prior to joining SIA's staff, she worked for the General Federation of Women's Clubs as the coordinator of the Women's History and Resource Center in Washington, DC.

Lisa has graduate degrees in history and library/information science. She is a member of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Archives Conference, serving as its presiding officer from 2003 to 2005, among numerous appointed and elected board positions. Lisa is also a long-time member of the Society of American Archivists and was elected to its board for 2013-2016. In 2020, Lisa was inducted as a Fellow of the society. She currently serves as Board Member of the Society of American Archivists Foundation, where she had also served as President. Lisa served on the New Jersey State Historical Records Advisory Board from 2004-2017 and is a member of the Cherry Hill Historical Commission.



Established in 1990 by Paul and Youngsuk Estabrook, the orchard currently consists of about 2,000 Asian pear trees. Halcyon Days have blended their deep respect for traditional methods with newly refined techniques to create their small batch cider production. As their name suggests, their aim is to return to a simpler time infused with calm and happiness.

Great Valley Farm Brewery & Winery

Rockbridge County's newest brewery is also a member of the Shenandoah Beerwerks Trail. Producing small-batch craft beer, Great Valley Farm Brewery sits on 27 picturesque acres with the Blue Ridge Mountains as a backdrop.
